<b>Role and intent:</b>	<p>Teaching staff are part of an energetic and dedicated team that support the learning of the children in their care.</p> <p>Primary Music Teachers must have an understanding of their curriculum field and apply the associated methodologies in their teaching practices. They are required to have involvement in teaching and a proven ability to teach in their field of study across Pre-Primary - Year 6.</p> <p>To provide a caring and exceptional educational environment for all students within a specific class during an academic year.</p> <p>To provide a caring and exceptional educational environment for all students within a specific class during an academic year.</p> <p>All Teachers must fulfil the 'Proficient Levels" in all of the AITSL Australian National Standards for Teachers.</p> <p>All Primary Specialists report directly to the Head of Campus who in turn reports directly to the Principal of St Stephen's School and is a member of the Executive Team.</p>
<b>Role requirements:</b>	<p><b>TEACHING AND LEARNING</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Direction of the Year 3 Strings Program (small group lessons) including designating instruments to students, assigning students to tutors in consultation with the Director of Music, selection of repertoire, directing rehearsals and both end of term Year 3 String program performances. Also oversees the maintenance and inventory of the string program instruments.</li> <li>• Teaches individual string lessons of 30 – 60 mins in duration for students between Year 4 – 12</li> <li>• Liases and works with a team of string tutors (violin, viola, cello and double bass) to develop the School orchestral string program</li> <li>• Direction of orchestral instrumental ensembles as required, including selection of repertoire, organisation and running of rehearsals and performances. There are approximately six in school performances plus the ABODA Festival annually. Also</li> </ul>



participates in the annual Senior Music Camp and international/national tours.

- Maintains the Orchestral String repertoire library and other teaching resources associated with the String program.
- *Experienced teacher of the Primary Music curriculum, ideally with Kodaly and Orff training that is reinforced in the teaching of students in the String program*
- Establish expectations for each student which are clear, challenging and achievable.
- Generate student interest, enthusiasm and motivation and make learning meaningful.
- Demonstrate thorough preparation and purposeful planning which caters for the differing needs of students.
- Use a range of effective strategies to support student learning and thinking.
- Use effective management which provides a teaching climate conducive to learning.
- Use a range of diagnostic and formative assessment processes to monitor student performance.
- Maintain effective communication with students and parents concerning each student's learning program and progress.
- Demonstrate awareness of the particular educational needs of different groups of students and the capacity to develop strategies to meet these needs.
- Engage with, and adapt to a variety of school systems, software and technologies that have been implemented to enhance teaching and learning outcomes.

- Foster in students an active and positive attitude to learning which generates mutual respect between teacher and learner.
- Build confidence and self-esteem in students.
- Show care for students and cater for their emotional needs.
- Cater for students' spiritual needs.
